Crosstabulation Results

Methodology:

This poll was conducted between March 29-March 31, 2022 among a sample of 2005 Registered Voters. The interviews were conducted online and the data were weighted to approximate a target sample of Registered Voters based on gender, educational attainment, age, race, and region. Results from the full survey have a margin of error of plus or minus 2 percentage points.

The U.S. government recently granted importers exclusions on 352 products made in China. The U.S. government grants exclusions if an importer is unable to source the product anywhere outside of China. Should importers be required to provide proof that they cannot source a product outside of China before the U.S. government grants an exclusion?* 25
